


STUDENT MINISTRY NEWS

SAY THAT AGAIN...When you were young, did it annoy you when your parents repeated themselves? Maybe they gave instructions and admonitions for the day. Then, just before you left the house to get on the bus, they went through that litany of direction one more time. And instead of listening, you mentally rolled your eyes. (You better not *really* roll your eyes!) That must have been what was happening with Abraham, Isaac, Jacob and several others in the Bible. Repeatedly God gave instructions, promised blessings, offered reassurance, only to repeat Himself again (and again). God promised Abraham. Isaac and Jacob that they would be a nation of nations, that they would inherit a land, that they would be blessed by God, that they would be a blessing to the rest of the world, that those who blessed them would be blessed by God. The message was not complicated. So why all the duplication? If you have sung in my choir (or any choir) you know that practice means rehearsing passages, sections of music, the entire song repeatedly. It's how we learn. There is a saying that most directors use. "There is no substitute for repetition." Repetition is how we learn. If a conductor wants to rehearse a passage again, it is because he detects that the singers aren't performing it correctly—they don't know the music! Same principle goes with God. When He repeated Himself, He knew that his followers did not yet fully understand what He was repeating. Do you know the phrase that God repeats the most in scripture? DO NOT BE AFRAID! God wants to bless us. And He want us to bless others. And He patiently reminds us of that. In closing, let me quote my parents: "How many times do I have to tell you?"
