

connections. . In my former profession as an industrial electrician I was aware that for a machine to operate correctly it needed a sound connection to its power source. A poor connection resulted in excessive heat and poor conductivity. Over a period of time and excessive heat the joint begins to break down further. Eventually the connection becomes so poor that electrical arcing can occur causing a fire and catastrophic damage. In some cases when an electrical episode occurs the only thing one can do is stand back and let it run its course and pick up the pieces later.

What is true in industry is true in our personal lives. Author Nicky Gumbel writes "...there is power in connection. Connections lead to life. When a husband and wife come together in love, babies are born. When the spirit of a person and the Spirit of God come together new birth takes place.
